

HiSET Testing Guidelines During the COVID-19 Pandemic in Montana

Examinees cannot be ill, have a fever, or been exposed to an individual with COVID-19 within the previous 14 days. Programs may ask examinees to have temperature checked.

Travel:

- Phase 1 of Governor's Directive:
 - Examinees cannot enter the building if they have been out of Montana for 14 days.
- Phase 2 of Governor's Directive:
 - Travel quarantine no longer in effect.

Room Capacity:

- Phase 1 of Governor's Directive:
 - Maximum of 10 people in the testing room with additional spacing to respect social distancing (6 foot minimum).
- Phase 2 of Governor's Directive:
 - Maximum 50 people in the testing room with additional spacing to respect social distancing (6 foot minimum).

Mask Requirement:

- Phase 1 of Governor's Directive:
 - Examinees *can* wear a mask and gloves to enter the building and while testing (must remove briefly for inspection and identification).
- Phase 2 of Governor's Directive:
 - Examinees *must* wear a mask and may wear gloves to enter the building and while testing (must remove briefly for inspection and identification) for those who live in counties with four or more active COVID cases.

Other:

- Examinees should not be in the High-Risk Category for COVID-19 and are encouraged to take the [HiSET at Home](#).
