Dear Senator Frist and Senator Daschle:

For the last several years, Congress has worked to prioritize special education funding, increasing appropriations by more than \$6.5 billion since 1996. We applaud your work, and we appreciate your commitment to reaching the goal of full funding for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. The undersigned chief state school officers urge you to support an amendment to the Labor-HHS-Education appropriations bill that would increase IDEA funding by \$2.2 billion in FY2004.

Earlier this year, Congress adopted a budget agreement that outlines a \$2.2 billion increase for special education. However, the FY2004 Labor-HHS-Education bill adopted by the Committee on Appropriations provides only a \$984 million increase for IDEA and falls far short of the funding level set by the budget. We encourage you to support an amendment to the Labor-HHS-Education bill that would restore IDEA appropriations to the level outlined in the budget.

As Congress works to find additional funding for IDEA, we are also concerned that increases to the program will come at the expense of other vital education, health, and labor programs. We urge you to fund the additional IDEA increase without making across the board cuts to other programs in the Labor-HHS-Education appropriations bill. An across the board cut would be devastating to other priority programs in No Child Left Behind. We have worked too hard on the implementation of No Child Left Behind to have services cut back at this early stage of the reform process. In the case of the Title I program, an across the board cut would decrease funding for disadvantaged students by more than \$100 million next year. Each of our states needs additional special education funds, but we cannot be asked to choose between our students with disabilities and our disadvantaged students served by Title I and other NCLB programs. Please oppose all amendments that are paid for with across the board cuts.

We look forward to working with you to reach the goal of full funding for IDEA.
