

• ARP ESSER or ESSER ARP Plan (use of funds)

 \odot High level anticipated use of funds

- Changeable through amendment process throughout grant life
- District generated and OPI/District maintained
- Update twice a year with community engagement
 - OPI required to view June and December
 - $\,\circ\,$ Consider updating in May and November
- Unique portal in Qualtrics secure access

• Generates a pdf file (confirmation email)

Stored on district site as a pdf



Safe Return Plans

• Similar to earthquake, intruder/lockdown plans

- Don't send to green door when it's been painted black
- \odot District generates and maintains
- O Update twice a year with community engagement
 - OPI required to view June and December • Consider updating May and November
- Stored on district site as a pdf



- Possible considerations for maintaining the Plans
 OPdf files stored in the same location
 - \circ Pdf files named with author, date, district name
 - Safe Return Plan Helena WF Nov22
 - ARP Plan Helena WF Nov22
 - \circ Pdf files on the same webpage
 - Single link can be uploaded into E-Grants (LEA Plan)



- Transparent and Trackable grant management
 - **ESSER ARP** (use of funds) **Plans**, due December and June
 - Safe Return Plans <u>Glendive</u>, <u>Evergreen</u>, due Dec and June

• For ALL activities charged to ESSER, costs must be reasonable and necessary to meet the overall purpose of the program, which is "to prevent, prepare for, and respond to" COVID-19 including those circumstances that were exacerbated by Covid. (See 2 CFR §§ 200.403-200.404.)

• Tracking of allocated funds

- The new ESSA requirement to report school-by-school spending provides a unique opportunity to inform policy, management, and improvement about the financial elements of schooling.
- <u>Two-year pilot</u> with greater transparency on spending related to outcomes...
- Anticipated data collection will be deeper
 A lot of money
 - from public pocket
 - \circ what was it spent on



- Track expenditures in excel/sheets braid not blend
 Clearly identify student gains/outcomes
 Review expenditures at least quarterly
- Engage the public

Promote and share out to build support



- Federal annual report
 - Funding and outcomes attached
 - Participation numbers and spending categories
- Ongoing ESSER stakeholder engagement
 - The active process of involving those who may be affected by ESSER decisions (students, parents, teachers, community)
 - Connecticut is giving students \$1.5 Million
 ESSER funds to make decisions on allocation

Welcome to the Emergency American Rescue Plan (ARP) and Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) webpage for the Office of Public Instruction

Superintendent Elsie Arntzen is proud to serve our Montana families, students, and teachers through the administration of the ESSER education funding of just over \$605 million. Each district was awarded ESSER funding based on Title I student count. Across the state, Districts are using ESSER funding in innovative, valuable ways, enabling schools and their partners to implement highly effective and beneficial programs. The countdown is here with ESSER I (CARES) expiring 2022, ESSER II (CRRSA) expiring 2023, and ESSER III (ARP) expiring 2024 (comparison chart p.4). OPI has established a system of support to ensure grant funding compliance and provide advocacy in use of funds.
