The individuals signing below verify that a meeting was conducted for the purpose of discussing issues related to the provision of services by the public school district to students, staff, and parents eligible for programs under the *Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) as amended (2015)* and other federally funded programs identified by the school district. Programs discussed may have included Title I, Part A; Title I, Part C – Migrant Education; Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education; Title II, Part A – Teacher and School Leaders; Title III, Part A – English Learners; Title IV, Part A – Student Support and Academic Enrichment; Title IV, Part B – 21st Century Community Learning Centers; Title IV, Part F – Project SERV; and Title VI, Indian, Native Hawaiian, and Alaska Native Education.

The following issues were discussed:

- A. What services will be offered
- B. How, where, and by whom the services will be provided
- C. How the services will be academically assessed and how the results of that assessment will be used to improve those services
- D. The size and scope of the services to be provided
- E. How and when the district will make decisions about the delivery of services to such children, including a thorough consideration and analysis of the views of the private school officials on the provision of services through a contract with potential third-party providers
- F. How, if the district disagrees with the views of the Tribal or Tribal Organization officials on the provision of services through a contract, the district will provide in writing to such Tribal Organization officials an analysis of the reasons why the district has chosen not to use a contractor
- G. Whether the district shall provide services directly or through a separate government agency, consortium, entity, or third-party contractor
- H. When, including the approximate time of day, services will be provided, and
- I. How the school district must give thorough consideration and analysis of the preferences of the Tribal or Tribal Organization officials regarding the provision of services; however, the public school district must make the final decision with respect to the services it will provide.



Tribal or Tribal Organization officials have the right to file a complaint with the State Education Agency if they feel the school district did not complete consultation in a timely and meaningful manner, did not give due consideration to the views of the Tribal or Tribal Organization officials, or did not make a decision that treats the American Indian, Native Hawaiian, or Alaska Native students equitably. If the school district disagrees with the view of the Tribal or Tribal Organization officials regarding the provision of educational services, the district will notify the Tribal or Tribal Organization officials in writing of the reasons why the district disagrees.

ш	Title I, Part A - Improving Basic Programs Operated by School Districts		
	Title I, Part A, provides services that are in addition to our regular instructional program. Instruction is provided by public		
	school teachers or through a contractor hired by the district. Services are provided to students who are educationally		
	disadvantaged and failing or most at risk of failing and who live in participating public school attendance areas.		
	Title I, Part C - Migrant Education Programs		
	The Migrant Education Program provides financial assistance to improve education for migratory children.		
	Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education		
	This program is for the development of academic and career or technical skills for students in middle and high school.		
	Title II, Part A - Preparing, Training and Recruiting High Quality Teachers, Principals, or Other School Leaders		
	The Teacher and Principal Training and Recruiting Fund provides assistance for preparing, training, recruiting and retaining		
	high quality teachers. Private school teachers, principals, and other educational personnel may participate in professional		
	development activities if the district uses funds to provide for professional development.		
	Title III, Part A - Language Instruction for English Learners and Immigrant Students		
	The Language Instruction for English Learner Students Program provides funds to help students learning the English		
	language to become proficient in English and meet the same challenging State academic standards required for all students.		
	Proficiency in a language is a measure of a person's ability to understand and communicate in that language or in a person's		
	preferred mode of communication. The Educational Programs for Immigrant Students provides funds to assist students from		
	other cultural or educational backgrounds as they adjust to the educational system in the United States.		
	Title IV, Part A – Student Support and Academic Enrichment Grants		
	These grants have the purpose of improving academic achievement of students by increasing the ability of states, districts,		
	schools, and local communities to provide all students with 1) a well-rounded education, 2) improved school conditions and		
	student learning, and 3) improved use of technology and digital literacy of all students.		
	Title IV, Part B - 21st Century Community Learning Centers		
	The 21st Century Community Learning Centers program provides services outside of the regular school day to children and		
	their families. This typically includes before school, after school, and summer programs, but may include programs at other		
	times as well. Programs may include academic enrichment activities, particularly for students who attend low-performing		
	schools, to help them meet State and local student performance standards in core academic subjects.		
	Title VI - Indian, Native Hawaiian, and Alaska Native Education		
	Title VI provides services to meet the unique educational and culturally related academic needs of American Indian, Native		
	Hawaiian, and Alaska Native students. This includes services to help these students gain knowledge and understanding of		
	Native communities, languages, tribal histories, traditions, and cultures. It also includes services to help teachers, principals,		
	other school leaders, and other staff who serve these students have the ability to provide culturally appropriate and effective		
	instruction and supports.		
	Title IV, Part F Project SERV;		
	Project SERV funds educated-related services for local education agencies to help them recover from a violent or traumatic		
	event in which the learning environment has been disrupted.
