

Statewide Alternate Assessment Eligibility Criteria Worksheet

This form is intended to assist IEP teams in determining whether the student should participate in the regular Statewide Assessment <u>or</u> the Statewide-Alternate Assessment <u>and</u> to address documentation requirements under IDEA. This form, when completed, must be attached to the student's IEP.

Does the student have an active IEP and receive services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)?	YES	NO
Do the student's demonstrated cognitive abilities and adaptive behavior require substantial adjustments to the general curriculum?	YES	NO
Do the student's learning objectives and expected outcomes focus on functional application of skills, as illustrated in the student's IEP annual goals and short-term objectives?	YES	NO
Does the student require direct and extensive instruction to acquire, maintain, generalize and transfer new skills?	YES	NO

If you answer "NO" to <u>any</u> of the above questions, the student must participate in the regular Statewide Assessment. If all answers are yes, the student is eligible to take the alternate and considered to be a student with a significant cognitive disability.

The decision to determine a student's eligibility to participate in the Statewide-Alternate Assessment may not be based on:

- Excessive or extended absence;
- Disability category;
- Social, cultural or economic difference;
- The amount of time receiving special education services; and
- Academic achievement significantly lower than his or her same age peers.
