Two of our conferences this year will be one day events held in Polson and Butte respectively. Schools can check in from 7:30 a.m. to 8:20 a.m. with the event beginning promptly at 8:30. A breakfast snack and lunch will be provided. The one-day events will conclude no later than 4:30. The two-day events will start on the respective Sunday with check in beginning at 1:00 p.m. and the official start at 2:00 p.m. A meal will be served on Sunday evening at 5:30 p.m. with activities concluding around 8:00 p.m. On Monday, we will begin at 8:00 a.m. and conclude by 2:30 p.m. Both breakfast and lunch will be provided on Monday.
