## Montana's Office of Public Instruction: 2018-2019 Public Reporting for Title IV-A

Title IV - A, also known as <u>Student Support and Academic Enrichment (SSAE</u>), is part of the Every Student Succeeds Act reauthorization of the ESEA. The SSAE program is intended to improve students' academic achievement by increasing the capacity of state educational agencies (SEAs), local educational agencies (LEAs), and local communities to provide all students with:

- Access to a well-rounded education
- Improve school conditions for student learning, safe and healthy students
- Effective use of technology to improve the academic achievement and digital literacy of all students

Montana (MT) used a formulary grant to ensure all 367 eligible districts in MT that received Title I allocations in the previous school year received funding under Title IV - A.
