



Montana High School Equivalency (HSE) 19 and Older Application for Online Proctored GED Tests

Applicants 19 years of age and older are eligible to take the GED High School Equivalency (HSE) exam using the online proctored option after Montana residency documentation is presented to the HSE Program at the Montana Office of Public Instruction.

High School Equivalency Testing Administrative Rules of Montana

10.66.111 QUALIFICATIONS FOR CANDIDATE TO RECEIVE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMAS

- (1) Candidates shall not be currently enrolled in school or have received an accredited high school diploma or high school equivalency credential.
- (2) Candidates shall receive a high school equivalency (HSE) diploma when scores meet or exceed the minimum score requirement established by the Board of Public Education.
- (3) Candidates must physically reside in Montana and have a Montana mailing address, or claim Montana as their state of residence if tested at a military installation or in a federal correctional institution.
- (4) Candidates must be at least 19 years of age.
