

MT ELA Standards Revision Workshop

Writing Team Agenda and Information Packet

July 15-18th

Purpose

The primary purpose of this 4-day workshop is for the writing team of the revision task force to draft revisions to the current standards.

Goals:

- Build standards revision groundwork and establish our process by
 - a. Developing team roles and responsibilities
- Identify the ELA needs of students
- Consider priorities, key shifts, practices, or essential skills that are necessary for students to know and be able to do.
- Review and revise the anchor standards to establish any structural or ideological shifts.
- Collaborate with your team to apply research evidence-based considerations to:
 - a. Revise grade-level standards language for Simplicity, Clarity, and Practicality
 - b. Align revisions of grade-level standards to a) anchor standards and b) vertically

Guiding Questions:

- What are some small shifts with a big impact (clarity) and big shifts with a small impact (simplicity)?
- What does the student need to know and be able to do in ELA at each grade level to interpret oral and written text?
- What are the age-appropriate needs of the child?
- What skills are needed to ensure a pathway to college and career readiness?
- What belongs in the standard? What is best suited for guidance documents?
