Please complete this form and return it, with the required documentation, to the Office of Public Instruction **by June 1** prior to the beginning of the school year in which you intend to open or reopen the junior high or high school. The OPI will approve or disapprove the opening of the school before the fourth Monday of June preceding the first year of intended operation. This process is in accordance with the Opening of Schools statute <u>Title 20, Chapter 6, Part 5, MCA</u>.

Additional Information

Opening A Junior High School When High School District Operates a County High School

Additional information for the opening of a junior high school under an existing high school district which operates a county high school can be found <u>20-6-505</u>, <u>MCA</u>. Per subsection (3), the requirements of the submission to the OPI are identical to the requirements for an application to open or reopen a junior high or high school.

Opening Of Middle School

For opening of a middle school, please use the *Request to Open or Reopen an Elementary School* form.

Per 20-6-501, MCA:

"A middle school is a school comprising the work of grades 4 through 8 or any combination of grades 4 through 8 that has been accredited as a middle school under the provisions of 20-7-102, MCA. When an accredited junior high school is operated by the district, grades 7 and 8 or their equivalents may not be considered as elementary grades."
