## Early Literacy Targeted Intervention Data Collection #2

Per <u>20-7-1803</u>, <u>MCA</u>, the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall monitor the Early Literacy-Targeted Intervention Program and gather data to evaluate the efficacy of the interventions while protecting the privacy rights of students and families. This data collection will focus on the classroom-based and home-based programs. Data about the Jumpstart program was collected within Data Collection #1 in the Fall of 2024.

## **District Representative**

Trustees offering an Early Literacy-Targeted Intervention shall closely monitor the program and report annually to the Superintendent of Public Instruction on the efficacy of the program no later than July 15. The report must include anonymized information on student progress, including the students' performance on (a) the evaluation methodology that led to
