- An "always on" internet connection that transmits data
- Provides high-speed access with multiple technologies
 - Fiber, Cable, DSL, Satellite, Wireless (Wi-Fi)
- 25 megabits per second (Mbps) minimum download speed
- 3 megabits per second minimum upload speed

Why is Broadband important?

Montana Internet facts in 2022

Montana has 135 internet service providers
 nationally 2,500+



- Montana ranks 46th regarding Internet coverage, speed, availability
- Montana ranked last regarding 1G access (only 5.8% had access)
- 9 in 10 residents can not purchase broadband at \$60 per month
- 8 in 10 residents can not purchase fiber internet
- During COVID schools were challenged to provide remote instruction




ESSER Funds for Broadband projects

- ESSER I (CARES) allocation 2 years ago
 - o 82% has been spent
 - Expires on September 30, 2022
 - No carry over
- ESSER II (CRRSA)
 - o 37% has been spent, expires 2023
- ESSER III (ARP)
 - 9% has been spent, expires 2024
- Other funds for Broadband






Technology and Impacting Factors

- Malware/Viruses




