Lead in School Program Timeline

2018 through 2019 – Developed Lead in School Program

November 21, 2019 – DEQ awarded \$192,000 (FY19) from EPA's Lead Testing in School and Childcare Program Drinking Water Grant. The grant was used to cover laboratory costs associated with lead sampling in schools. Funding can only be used for sample related activities.

<u>January 17, 2020</u> - Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS) adopted amendments to the administrative rules regarding the matter of health in Montana schools. The amendments included requirements pertaining to reducing lead in schools' drinking water. It requires all schools accredited by the Montana Board of Public Education to sample for lead in schools' drinking water. (Administrative Rules of Montana 37.11.832).

<u>January 22, 2020</u> – DEQ/DPHHS presented at MT Rural Water's Annual Small Systems and Colony Operators Training Conference. Presented general overview of the Lead in School program.

<u>January/February 2020</u> – Notification of the Lead sampling program was sent out to all schools.

<u>Winter/Spring/Summer 2020</u> – Held a number of Lead in School Working Group Meetings to discuss school communication, prioritizing school sampling, training, and funding. Agencies and associations in attendance included:

<u>May 29, 2020</u> – Finalized Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between DEQ and OPI to create a Lead Remediation Reimbursement Program for schools. OPI will manage the program and DEQ provided the \$40,000 in funding.

<u>July 28, 2020</u> – Joint Press Release with DEQ and Kalispell Public Schools summarizing the Kalispel's schools recent lead results and the lead in school program.

October 15, 2020 – DEQ/DPHHS presented at the MT Conference of Education Leadership (MCEL) conference.

October 2020 – Finalized contracts with 2 technical assistance providers (MT Rural Water and Midwest Assistance Program) to provide schools assistance with the Lead in School program.

<u>Throughout 2020</u> – A number of lead in school reminders were included in OPI's monthly newsletters.

<u>2/25/2021</u> – Lead in School Working Group Meeting – Provided a program update to the group on results, database changes, communication, and funding.

May 18, 2021 – DEQ awarded an additional \$265,000 (FY20) from EPA's Lead Testing in School and Childcare Program Drinking Water Grant. The grant funding will continue to be used to cover laboratory costs associated with lead sampling in schools.

<u>June 2, 2021</u> - Lead in School Working Group Meeting – Provided a program update to the group on results, database changes, communication, and funding.

<u>July 08, 2021</u> - DEQ awarded an additional \$265,000 (FY21) from EPA's Lead Testing in School and Childcare Program Drinking Water Grant. The grant funding will continue to be used to cover laboratory costs associated with lead sampling in schools. Total grant funds are \$722,000.

<u>August 10, 2021</u> – Joint Press Release with DEQ and DPHHS urging schools to test for lead in their drinking water.

September 1, 2021 – Water flushing plans were required to be submitted to DEQ.

<u>September 27, 2021</u> – DEQ/DPHHS presented at the MT Association of School Business Officials conference.

October 7, 2021 – DEQ/DPHHS presented a MT State Fund webinar held for school facility staff.
