ESA: FAQs for Districts

What if a student's identification as a child with a disability under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) changes after the application period for an eligible student?

• Contact the OPI ESA Specialist with any updated evaluation report information.

What are the district's responsibilities?

Students who participate in the ESA program are considered a parental placement under the IDEA, 20 U.S.C. 1412. MCA 20-7-1706(2). Districts have all the same responsibilities for students in the ESA program as any student in a parentally placed private school placement, including the following:

- Child find as required by federal and state law (34 CFR 300.131; ARM 10.16.3125)
- Reevaluations (34 CFR 300.303(b))
- Potentially provide Equitable Services as set out in a <u>Private School Services Plan</u>. Equitable services are special education and related services, including direct services, provided to parentally placed private school students with disabilities according to 34 CFR 300.130 through 300.144.
- <u>Private School Offer of FAPE</u> form provided to the parent, if not already done.

What other responsibilities might there be for districts?

- Provide an SSID # (if the student does not have one)
 - New to Montana students or students entering kindergarten
- Create enrollment to flag ESA students in AIM for ANB purposes <u>AIM Guidance</u>
