

- Addressed the Lead in School Drinking Water portion of the <u>DPHHS proposed rules</u>
 - DEQ, along with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), has secured funding to pay for the initial round of sampling
 - Guidance on how to do the sampling has been developed
 - DEQ will provide training and technical assistance to support schools in their sampling
