

Annual Data Collection vs Accreditation

- The Annual Data Collection will still take place in the Fall.
 - 95% moving to Infinite Campus, a few small things that will be collected in new Acc. Program
 - Schools still required to report that information annually
- Accreditation will be able to pull that data, but at a different time.
 - Potentially spring instead of fall
 - No longer in charge of the annual data collection



Data Programs

- The annual data collection information will be moving to Infinite Campus.
 - We will be able to pull the data needed for accreditation purposes
- There will be a new system being developed specifically for accreditation
 - This will allow for a complete separation from annual data collection.
- Schools already putting data in IC; so this significantly reduces duplication of data entry.

Update to Ch. 55

Effective 4/12/23

- Superintendent acknowledges the importance of changing new graduation requirements effective date
- BPE held a special meeting April 12th about implementation date for ARM 10.55.905- Economics/Financial Literacy and Government/Civics
- July 1, 2023 was approved however after receiving feedback from districts the BPE acknowledged the need for more time to get proper curriculum, licensed teachers, and schedules that allow for the new requirements
- BPE voted unanimously to extend the effective date of ARM 10.55.905 to July 1, 2025
- This means the graduating class of 2026 would be the first class required
- Districts basic education offerings are still changing (10.55.904) and the courses need to be offered July 1, 2023
