# Discussion: B. Montana Innovative Educational Program Tax Credit (Crews)

Beginning on October 2, 2024, at 9:00 a.m., a limited number of Public School District (PSD) tax credits for tax year 2024 will become available on the Education Donations<sup>2</sup> Portal.

These tax credits are available because some previously approved credits became invalid. A credit reservation can become invalid if a donation amount was recorded incorrectly, or a PSD returned a donation to a donor. These invalid credit amounts will be "put back" in the pool of available credits as of October 2, 2024.

## Reports: B. Principals' Report (Chumrau and Ries)

This month, our Target Range teaching teams are putting into practice skills and strategies they learned over the summer. Their enthusiasm and experience make for a rich and engaging learning environment. The teams are getting used to the new leadership structure, their new curriculum,

and new students. Students are remembering what it is like to be in school. The energy is positive and they seem happy and excited to be back in school.

# **Teaching and Learning**

# **Faculty**

Focusing is to build on enhancing and enriching our **culture of learning** is of great importance. In support of Superintendent, Mr. Crews' goals, we introduced the following practices:

- Trusted Colleague Collaboration the intentional practice of partnering year round with a colleague in an effort to support one another and to build knowledge and skills. By now, all of our teachers have selected a trusted colleague and in the next couple of weeks we will be providing time for the colleagues to meet to discuss any challenges they might be experiencing and to share best practices. It is our hope that the meaningful conversations will result in thoughtful improvements in the classrooms.
- Monthly Stand Up Snapshots the practice of offering quick stand up meetings where colleagues are offered the opportunity to engage in training related to our math curriculum and literacy curriculums. Teachers teaching teachers and sharing best practices. Our first Muffins and Math Meeting took place before school on September 11th and gave our teachers a venue to learn and discuss some strategies they can immediately take back to their classroom. Veteran teacher, Sandy Squillace, plans to meet monthly with teachers to share best practices, offer support with curriculum implementation, and to provide opportunities to discuss and work through challenges. Ongoing access to video training and consultation on social emotional well being, behavioral supports, and classroom management as it relates to tiered systems of support. In addition, another veteran teacher, Michelle MacIntyre, will also offer a monthly meeting, Reading Rally, where she will offer similar support, but based in Literacy.
- We are starting a new practice of sharing learning videos with every weekly update so that our faculty can access learning when it is convenient for them. So far, our videos include information about supporting students through Multi-tiered systems of Support. We are also creating videos that help teachers better understand basic day to day procedures within the school. We anticipate that the library we create now will be of great use for years to come. It will be especially useful for new teachers and para educators.

## **Families**

Our hope is to extend the **culture for learning** beyond the classroom. This month, we are hosting a Parent Engagement Night on September 24th. Our first presenter is Kayli Julius, Kayli is the Wellbeing Director at the Curry Health Center at the University of Montana. The Workshop Title is "Healthy Habits for Growing Families: Nutrition and Sleep for Elementary-Aged Children". This engaging workshop is designed to help parents understand the critical role nutrition and sleep play in the development of elementary-aged children. The workshop is designed to provide parents with practical, easy-to-apply strategies for fostering healthy eating and sleep habits in their children, setting them up for success both academically and in their overall well-being.

# Well-being

In August and September we hosted two assemblies, one for each division (Upper 5-8 & Lower K-4) of the school. Everyone seems to enjoy the student-led assemblies and it is great to see the students taking agency in their learning as they become confident speakers and presenters. On September

27, we will come together as a whole school to celebrate a full week of learning focused on Indian Education. The culminating event will highlight singers, dancers, and drummers.

As we mentioned in our previous report, we want to create a space to apprise you of possible behavioral student challenges. At this time, we are in the process of monitoring the well-being of several students at multiple grades, but we are not at the point where you need to be made aware of any specific situations.

## **New Hires and Job Openings**

We are in great need of substitute teachers. Please help spread the word to people who would be a good fit with our students and staff.

We are in the process of screening applicants for a recently vacated para position. Shoutout to Charity for getting the word out quickly as we have several applicants in the hiring pool.

## Extra Curricular Activities
