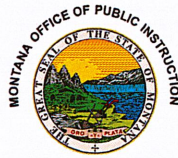

Elysian Middle School

The standards for which the variance are requested are 10.55.705 Administrative Personnel: Assignment of School Administrators/Principals ; and 10.55.704 Administrative Personnel: Assignment of District Superintendent



2. Describe the variance requested.

Elysian School District is a County K-8 School District in Yellowstone County. It houses all K-8 students under one roof. The current overall population for the District (K-8) is 450 students. Under Montana rule 10.55.705 a Principal (1.0 FTE) can serve 250-549 students. Elysian is well under that maximum number and all within the same building. However, because we are a K-5 elementary school and 6-8 Middle school by the wording of the law we have to have a fulltime principal for our Elementary (population 303) and would have to hire a 0.25 principal for the Middle School (population 127).

Our certified teaching staff is 30.5 FTE which according to 10.55.705 would allow the Superintendent to fill this 0.25 position in the Middle School as Principal and cover the Superintendent role for the District. However, when the Principal position is counted as certified staff and then the superintendent's 0.25 FTE for the Principal position in the Middle School this pushes our certified FTE to 31.75 which does not allow for a split Superintendent role.

Due to the fact that the entire school district falls within the parameters of student population that an elementary school across the highway could operate under with a 1.0 FTE Principal, Elysian School District is requesting that same opportunity if it so chooses.

3. Describe how and why the proposed variance would be:

a. Workable.

The variance to have a 1.0 FTE Principal be the administrator for 450 students under one roof is workable at any other elementary school in the state under the above standard listed. Elysian School District and taxpayers should not be denied the opportunity to operate budgetarily as other districts with similar populations because they are considered 2 separate schools when they operate under the same roof, share 1 gym, 1 lunchroom and share hallways.

Elysian School District also houses the Superintendent in the same building as the school(s) which allows for administrative help when needed.



b. Educationally sound.

Elysian School District has and will maintain its high standards in education and supporting the learning of its student body. This is documented and measured through Elysians state and district assessments over the years. Student safety and well being are a top priority for the Elysian School District. Allowing our Principal to be the administrator of 250-549 students in the same building is allowed under the Montana Administrative Rules for other schools, Elysian is well under this maximum and will operate in the same manner it has over the past years with similar population levels.

c. Designed to meet or exceed results under established standards.

This variance in no way disrupts or changes Elysian's academic plans or goals for its student body. Elysians Integrated School Action Plan remains in place and is unaffected by the allowance of this variance.

Elysians English Language Arts / Literacy and Math delivery standards are not impacted by this variance. Elysian's academic goals in these areas as detailed in our ISAP are still attainable and unaffected with allowing this variance.

Hiring Process for Stipend Positions

Clerk Herman told the board she had asked on the form for School Business Officials for schools to share their process for hiring stipend positions. The schools who responded stated they post the position and go through the interview process even if there is only one applicant.

School Expansion

Superintendent Shelton stated he spoke with Mr. McCall regarding the development being done in the Elysian School District. Mr. McCall informed him the current phase of development is ending however new land has been purchased. He stated the plan is to build 90 homes per year for the next 5 or 6 years. Superintendent Shelton predicts Elysian can see an increase of 235 students in the next five years. He stated now is the time to start looking at expansion as it is usually a three-year process. He stated the process to start would be to form a committee to start looking into expansion and public relations. He stated last time Elysian did this the committee consisted of two board members, two staff members and two community members. His recommendation is to have the same process this time.

District Reports

Clerk's Report

Clerk Herman reported to the board she would be attending an election webinar as there have be several legislature changes concerning school elections. She also stated she talked with business office personnel at Belgrade School District on their procedure for accepting credit cards. They use Square as their credit card processor. She will be looking into it further. She also stated she signed up for the New Clerk Academy. This is a new form of support for new school business officials Montana Association of School Board Officials has developed. It is a two-year process to give additional support to new business managers and district clerks. She also will be auditing the class on Montana school finance Roger Heimbigner teaches at Rocky Mountain College.

Parent teacher conferences are scheduled. The school will be providing meals for the teachers and coffee and cookies for the parents. The PTO carnival had a great turn out. The insurance claim for the repairs due to the lightning strike is \$71,375.50. The claim is being sent to the underwriter. The boiler is up and working and the HAVAC has been fixed. Lab kits the Science teachers have chosen to use have been ordered. This year the curriculum ration is Math. This is being worked on. He is looking to find a used truck with a plow to purchase. Having a larger plow would make snow removal in the parking lot go much faster. Elysian's health insurance quote from Bridged Health Alliance should be coming this week.
