NAEP is the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what students in the United States know and can do in various subjects. Participation is required under the Every Student Succeeds Act (or ESSA) for any district receiving Title 1 funding.

The link provided in the registration email is to answer the questions in the *School Information* section, this will provide us with the most up-to-date school and contact information.
