Thank you for all that you do to support education in Montana. In July, I notified your district of its selection to participate in the 2026 administration of the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), also known as *The Nation's Report Card*. NAEP is the largest nationally representative and continuing assessment of what students in the United States know and can do in various subjects and is administered by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) within the U.S. Department of Education. Participation is required under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) reauthorization of 2015 for any district receiving Title I funding.

I am writing to provide you with additional information. «School_Name» has been selected to represent schools across the nation. NAEP will administer a digitally-based assessment in mathematics and reading at grades 4, 8 and 12 and civics and U.S. history at grade 8 from **January 26 – March 20, 2026**. Each student will be assessed in one subject only. Selected schools are notified in advance so you can include the NAEP assessment window on their school calendars and incorporate NAEP into the planned school program.

As conducted in previous years, NAEP representatives provide significant support to schools by administering the assessment. We've collaborated with your district's technology staff, «Technology_Coordinator_Fname» «Technology_Coordinator_Lname» to determine which mode of administration works best for your school. Your school has been assigned to **school devices and Internet**. Please provide dedicated space for most, if not all, of the day with tables or flat desks and an adequate number of electrical outlets in the assessment location.

To prepare for the assessment, NAEP would like to begin preparations with a designated **school coordinator** who will serve as the single point of contact for all matters pertaining to the NAEP assessment. It's important that the district's technology staff and the School Coordinator work together to prepare for the assessment day.
