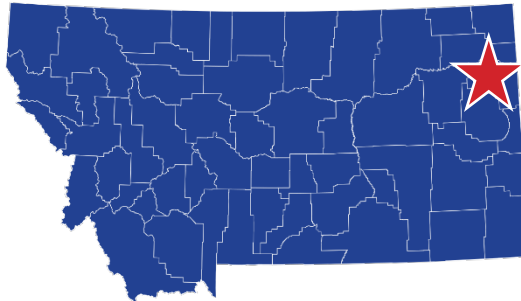

### Program Description:

The Boys & Girls Club of Richland County Afterschool and Summer programs address academic achievement and minimization of learning loss, social-emotional wellness, and healthy lifestyle, and character and leadership development. Serving pre-K through 6<sup>th</sup> grade with high school students employed as program aides/interns. Through many community partnerships and ELO funding the program has been able to offer the Mango Math curriculum for over five years as well as literacy work. The program has strived to increase overall student achievement in math by 5%, increase literacy skills through writing, and improve social-emotional skills among students.

### Student Gains:

- Respond to COVID-19 learning loss by increasing average math scores by 5%.
- Prevent the spread of COVID-19 and other communicable diseases through sanitation and cleaning procedures.
- Respond to the decline of social-emotional wellness and mental health struggles that occurred because of COVID-19.
