

WIDA SCREENERS AND STUDENT IDENTIFICATION



The new WIDA Screener for Kindergarten is here! The training and certification course is live in the <u>WIDA Secure Portal</u>. The K W-APT screening tool is still available through spring, but will be retired after this school year.

- Please ensure that your district distributes a <u>home language survey</u> to flag potential ML/EL students.
- Positive identification must be based on documented screener scores. See the OPI's <u>English Learner Guidance for School Districts</u> for detailed information.
- Work with your district clerk to enroll students in the EL program in AIM.
