American Indian Heritage Day September 26, 2025



In 1997, the Montana Legislature passed into law MCA 20-1-306, designating the fourth Friday in September as American Indian Heritage Day. Under this law, **schools** are to conduct "appropriate exercises during the school day." In 2009, MCA 1-1-228 was signed into law designating the last Friday in September as American Indian Heritage Day for the state of Montana for **all Montanans** to "(1) reflect on American Indian culture and heritage; and (2) celebrate American Indians and their culture and heritage. . .." We celebrate the Montana Constitution and reaffirm our unique constitutional commitment to implement Indian Education for All. Honor Song for All Students and Teachers

Activities that celebrate American Indian Heritage Day can create sustained interest in learning about the distinct and unique cultural heritage of American Indians, setting the tone and creating connections for a year of integrating Indian Education for All.
