



#### **General Implementation Strategies and Tips**

The following tips are taken from page 14 of *The Framework*. The specific ideas presented here are suggestions to support local efforts. Teachers and administrators use them to design plans meeting the spirit of the law and address the unique capacity and characteristics of their districts. Here are a few suggestions:

- Don't work alone. The more staff members and perspectives brought to the table during plan development, the better. Assemble a team that includes both local experts and novices.
- Take advantage of and use The Framework and its appendices to create a skeletal plan then focus in on elements of the plan for more intensive and detailed work and implementation.
- The Areas of Activity The Preliminary Planning Tool found in Appendix F (pg. 60) could be helpful in developing subcommittee, assigning tasks, and outlining action steps.
- Meet, talk, and read regularly. The process of planning is a professional development journey, and it can be fun and engaging.
- Integrate your IEFA plan with the ongoing continuous school improvement plan. Integration must be modeled at all levels: planning, professional development, and in classrooms.
- The IEFA plan could be completely woven into the very fabric of the comprehensive district plan. Integrated goals are more robust than isolated or segregated goals.
