The Montana Advisory Council on Indian Education (MACIE) meeting was called to order at 9:19 a.m. Welcome words were provided by Norma Bixby and roll call was taken.

Fort Peck Head Start

Minutes

Chelsie McKee

The minutes of the February 1, 2023, meeting were reviewed. No corrections were made. Norma Bixby motioned to approve them as written and Iris Kill Eagle seconded the motion. Passed by all.

Reports

Indian Education for All

Zach Hawkins and Mike Jetty provided information regarding the in-person Indian Education for All (IEFA) Best Practices Conference and ongoing initiatives, including virtual conference, student Essential Understandings video project, grants, webinars, website updates, and publications creation updates.

Montana University System

Angela McLean expressed continued appreciation for MACIE and the Montana University System's (MUS) seat at the table. Jordann Forster was the keynote Grow Your Own educator event with students from Browning, Havre, Great Falls schools who will becoming classroom teachers.

Enrollment of American Indian students is growing on all campuses. The last two years had the highest retention. There has been an 18% growth in completions from last year to this year.

Superintendent

Superintendent Elsie Arntzen provided information on the tribal education, the Montana Alternative Assessment Testing Program, the Native youth and Tribal Nations conferences, American Indian graduation and dropout rates, use of COVID funding to produce a library of language curriculum, IEFA Rotunda Day. Jonathan Jay Eagleman talked about his new position.

New Business

Budget Discussion

Jay Phillips discussed the budget process, how to fund the MACIE meetings, and previous funding to MACIE, and how much time was taken by Office of Public Instruction (OPI) staff to help with MACIE. OPI will need to know how many in-person meetings will be in the next year. Susie Hedalen indicated she was disheartened that OPI is breaking out time for OPI employees when doing MACIE work.

Norma Bixby indicated there has never been a question before regarding funding MACIE meetings.

Chairperson Report

Chairperson Jordann Forster congratulated Cory Sangrey-Billy on MACIE membership for the tribal colleges and Jay Eagleman's new position at OPI.

MACIE members shared community events.

Jordann discussed her dissertation regarding the effects of IEFA on Native students and their engagement with schoolwork.

Jordann started to review the agenda, and the meeting devolved into the agenda.

Old Business

Lessons review

Chairperson Jordann Forster does not know where want to go with the Missing and Murdered Indigenous People, Trauma-Informed Restorative practices, and Grief Resources documents presented to MACIE previously and if there needs more discussion.

There was no discussion on this. Donnie Wetzel indicated the direction the Tribal Student Achievement, Relations, and Resiliency Unit will be taking regarding student achievement.

New Business

Goals

Chairperson Jordann Forster asked for suggestions on goals. Suggestions:

- ✓ Native based curriculum (get tribal council member involved)
- ✓ Repository from tribes of people resources
- √ tribal government
- ✓ graduation rate
- ✓ standards based education
- ✓ testing of Indian education content
- ✓ tribes produce their own standards
- ✓ protocols
- √ how to support comprehensive schools
- ✓ attendance barriers

The goals selected were an update on the IEFA lawsuit, update on <u>achievement data document</u>, and what schools are getting deficiency notices year after year.

Meeting Schedule

Discussion regarding the MACIE meeting schedule for 2024 happened. It was decided the inperson meetings (with Zoom option) should sometimes be held on reservations. The in-person meeting will be six hours and the online ones will be three hours.

The schedule for the rest of 2023 is May and June (Zoom), August (Zoom), October (in-person), and November (Zoom).

Jonathan Jay Eagleman discussed the work the Class 7 Teachers Alliance is doing regarding professional development training for Class 7 teachers and instructional strategies for assessment.

Public Comment

Levi Black Eagle asked about next steps regarding the budget and agenda. Chairperson Forster will take what has been decided today to Jay Phillips and the Superintendent. This will then be brought back to a future meeting for final approval.

Levi Black Eagle motioned to adjourn the meeting and Dugan Coburn seconded the motion. Passed by all.
