The new licensure system Teach Montana (TMT) is up and running. The biggest change that you will see is that an educator will now be responsible for printing their own license. This means that the Office of Public Instruction will no longer be mailing certificates. An educator can download a copy of their license from TMT and provide that to their districts and county superintendents for registration.

The license looks *very* different! Below is an image of what the license looks like. It is one-sided and is the official license that is issued from the Office Public Instruction through the TMT licensure system.



Crystal Andrews, Director of Educator Licensure at the OPI met with Montana County Superintendents on June 8th to discuss the changes to the license and what to expect. They are aware of the above information, and educators should not have any issues getting their license registered.
