



Questionnaire Statement of Purpose

This questionnaire is designed to investigate the effectiveness of MAST as a formative teaching tool. It aims to describe both the student test-taking experience and the usefulness of the assessment as a resource for providing timely and relevant feedback. Another main objective is to identify areas where the design and delivery of MAST can be improved. Please note that responses from this questionnaire are for research purposes only and will not be used to evaluate the performance of individual students, teachers, or schools. Administration Procedure

Each student will be presented with six questions from a question bank: five multiple choice questions and one free response question. Questionnaire instructions direct students to consider their experience with either math or ELA testlets. This distinction is reflected only in the survey instructions; the survey questions for math and ELA are identical. The assignment of math versus ELA questionnaires is random. Students should take the survey only after all assigned testlets for the window are completed.
