The MSAA Spring 2024 Online Reporting Window is now open and will be available from July 15, 2024 (8am ET) – September 6, 2024 (8pm ET).

During this Online Reporting Window access will be as follows:

- Test Administrators – Dashboard and Sample Items
- Test Coordinators – Dashboard, Sample Items, Organizations, Reports and Users.

IMPORTANT NOTE: MSAA Score Reports are only available for a short-window after data reconciliation is completed. For the AY24, the deadline for schools to download reports is SEPTEMBER 6, 2024.

Performance Level Descriptors

English Language Arts

- ✓ use literary texts with clear to implied ideas to identify details that support a summary or details used to develop a story, identify why an author uses specific word choices
- ✓ use informational texts with clear to implied ideas to identify details that support a conclusion or develop a central idea, identify an author's point of view and why an author uses specific word choices, answer questions using details presented in two texts
- ✓ use context to define phrases
- ✓ develop an explanatory text by identifying and grouping relevant information to address the topic
- ✓ develop an argument by identifying introduction, claim, evidence, and conclusion
- ✓ write an argumentative text with partial command of organization, idea development and/or conventions

Mathematics

- ✓ solve simple word problems using mathematical language and symbolic representations (e.g., $<$, $>$, $=$, x , y)
- ✓ write equations that contain a variable
- ✓ solve a real-world problem using a line graph
- ✓ calculate the mean and median of a set of data
- ✓ identify the hypotenuse of a right triangle
- ✓ identify the greatest or least value of data shown on a number line
- ✓ identify the missing label on a histogram
- ✓ identify a model that represents a square number
