WHAT'S NEW? NEW COURSE OFFERINGS

Montana State University-Northern's Department of Education has a collaborative agreement with Great Falls College-MSU. Students at GFC MSU and residents in the Great Falls area now have access to an affordable Bachelor of Science in Education. Through collaboration with GFC-MSU, students can begin Education coursework their third year (junior standing) with live instruction at the GFC campus by faculty who are master teachers. Classes meet after 4 p.m. four evenings a week enabling students to earn a Bachelor's degree in Education in two years without leaving home or their jobs.
