NEW COURSE OFFERINGS

Among our PreK-12 education degree offerings, that welcome all students, is our Native Language Teacher Education Program. To meet the needs of our communities and the requests from our sister-tribes and language and culture revitalization programs within the state of Montana and Interior Northwest, the Salish Language Educators Development program within Salish Kootenai College's Division of Education is transitioning to become the Native Language Teacher Education (NLTE) Program and is working to build the capacity necessary for the eventual creation of a center focused on Indigenous language and culture education. Through conversations with community partners, it has been determined that the NLTE Program will focus on achieving three overarching objectives, each containing subobjectives. This center will be guided through building and maintaining partnerships and continuing collaborative efforts within our Indigenous language and culture education network throughout the Flathead Reservation, Montana, and our aboriginal homelands within the Interior Northwest.
